Owner Profile – Ed and Connie Bowlin

Within the aviation community, you have an eclectic group of people who are united in a shared passion. Many are individuals who support, protect, and promote the industry and the efforts of their peers. Ed and Connie Bowlin have built their lives and careers around aviation and those who have, and continue, to make it great. It is thus fitting with November designated as Aviation History Month, that the Bowlins took an opportunity to share a bit of their story.

When they are not off on one of their many adventures, Ed and Connie live fulltime in Griffin, Georgia on their quiet 115 acre farm with their five horses (3 Arabians and 2 American Quarter Horses). The Bowlins were introduced to Heaven's Landing by friend Jerry Underwood, an LLC partner, at a time when the development was in its infancy.

Ed and Connie fell in love with the amazing views and gentle hardwood slopes of Lot #44 and purchased Hangar A-2. The land, along with "an extremely nice climate, attitudes of the people who live here, and the rural guiet touch," offers a retreat and a home away from home.

Their life together began when Connie and Ed met in 1972 while they both were working for Delta Airlines. Ed was a pilot and Connie was a flight attendant with dreams of being up front—where only men had traditionally been... Ed and Connie married in 1974, and it started an amazing aviation partnership. With Ed by her side, and as she puts it, "[I began to fly] everything that came along. I was able to get the ratings and build enough flying time to be hired as a Delta pilot in 1978". Connie was the fourth female pilot at Delta. Both worked for Delta for over thirty years when they retired. The two have a long list of type ratings in both commercial and "fun" aircraft. "I owe everything to Ed, my friend, mentor, and supporter. Sharing the many facets of aviation with him allowed me the opportunity to pursue a great career."

At every given opportunity the couple immersed themselves into their craft, learning new skills and taking the opportunity to fly hundreds of historic and well-known airplanes. Together they have accumulated over 50,000 hours. Their dedication to the industry and involvement in many aviation organizations, including AOPA and EAA, has allowed them to educate the public in all aspects of aviation and make countless and often very notable friends along the way. They began the very popular "Warbirds in Review" for EAA AirVenture Oshkosh which draws large crowds to interact with aviation legends beside many of the aircraft types they flew. These efforts over the years, have also given Ed and Connie the opportunity to call once childhood heroes, now dear friends. Sadly these are friends of a generation that is fading away. In the past five years, both their hunting buddy, friend, and Flying Tiger ace, David Lee "Tex" Hill (92), as well as their friend and fellow Flying Tiger, Robert L. Scott (97), from Ed's childhood dreams, have passed away.



The Bowlins continue to honor "the greats" through their current business, <u>Aviation Autographs</u> —a website catalog of collectible books and memorabilia offered to the public that was stored away for decades. In a partnership with friend, Lt. Col. Dave McFarland (USAF, retired) and from their own private collections, Aviationautographs.com has a very impressive inventory. Lt. Col. McFarland's spent years working alongside the greatest aviators from around the world.

The Bowlins themselves have been honored many times as they "[join] others who have outstanding and lasting contributions to the advancement of aviation.*" Their most recent ceremonies were in 2008, when Connie was inducted into the EAA Warbirds of America Hall of Fame, and in 2009, when the Bowlins were jointly honored and inducted into the Georgia Aviation Hall of Fame* in Warner Robins, GA. These dedications have given the couple and the GA community an opportunity to reflect on their extensive careers and the amazing impact they have had on aviation.

For Ed and Connie, the passion for aviation that they share began at a very young age. Ed was not even 10 in the late 1940's, an age of daring heroes and a World War. He recalls watching planes fly overhead from a local base in Tennessee. "All I wanted to do was be a fighter pilot," he recalls. "I must have seen Robert L. Scott's "God is my Co-pilot" a dozen time." Ed would get his opportunity during a high school career day when he was challenged to take the entrance exam. Among his many accomplishments, he went on to spend 15 years as a pilot in the Air National Guard and U.S. Air Force, owning an aircraft sales and consulting business, and retiring from Delta in 1990.

Connie had a similar background. Growing up in the North Carolina tobacco country, she recalls being in awe of crop dusters. Her stead-

fast dreams and determination would take her above and beyond the "glass ceiling" to owning over 200 planes. For a long time, she has been known as the only female pilot certified to fly the B-17, and still turns heads as she jumps from the cockpit of the P-51 (please take a moment to read Roy Stafford's tribute to Connie). Connie even finds time to write for many aviation journals and magazines. Her latest contribution appeared in the August issue of Sport Aviation Online.

Giving, ground breaking, humble, dedicated—the list of adjectives to describe this couple is probably nearly endless. The Bowlins have contributed to Heaven's Landing in the same fashion that they do in all their other interactions. It was the Bowlins who were instrumental in inviting 5 flying aces to the 2003 grand opening at Heaven's Landing, and it is the Bowlins who have worked diligently for the instrument approach which was recently authorized for the development. It is a gift to have them in our midst as they grace us with their time and talents.

Around the Bend- Rabun Gap Nacoochee School

The 2010-2011 school year is well on its way in Rabun County, but it is primetime to consider the options

available for the next academic year.



Heaven's Landing is fortunate to have three excellent educational choices which serve the community: Rabun County Schools (RCS), Tallulah Falls School (TFS), and Rabun Gap Nacoochee School (RGNS). A daunting reoccurring question that many parents face becomes, "what will be the best environment for my child and their future goals?" As my family begins this quest, we wish to share a sampling of this journey. It is a big decision for parents and grandparents of middle and high school-aged children. Here is a guick look and a little insight into one of these three great NE Georgia opportunities.



Rabun Gap-Nacoochee is a well-respected fully accredited college-preparatory day and boarding school for grades 6—12, located in Rabun Gap, Georgia (4 miles from Heaven's Landing's gates). The 1,400 acre campus boasts a student body of less than 400, with 19 states and 15 countries represented. Class size is currently 13 for the middle school and ranges from 8-16 for the upper school. For over 100 years, RGNS's mission has been to offer a high quality education which engages students with eager minds to "become exceptional" and "move mountains."

Rabun Gap Nacoochee is a liberal arts school with a broad base of core studies and extracurricular opportunities. Coupled with state of the art facilities, the school offers a multitude of choices available in performing, visual, and industrial technology arts. The curriculum is taught using the Socratic method emphasizing a hands-on approach to course work with advanced placement courses available in all departments. One will find that the afterschool activities are as varied as children's personalities. Students may chose from athletics, a range of clubs, an outdoor program (complete with a high-angle ropes course and multi-use lake), and an extensive farm husbandry program.

One of the many charms found at RGN is in the created culture which inspires and develops students' individual gifts as a result of the guidance and support provided by faculty and peers. Dorm life appears to be rich and well supervised, and both boarding and day students have advisors and mentors to aid in learning responsibility and accountability.



To further strengthen student pride, two events showcase the extraordinary efforts and abilities of the student body the annual Cirque performance and MAD Fest. Now in their tenth year and based on the tradition of the world renown Cirque du Soleil, RGN's Cirque is a production like no other. Performed each February, Cirque engages over 20% of the student body in acting, singing, spectacular acrobatic training, and behind the scenes roles in writing, design, technical support, and all other aspects of a production.



Signaling the end of the school year, MAD Fest is the springtime celebration of Music, Art, Dance, and Drama! The halls, galleries, and theater at Rabun Gap Nacoochee teem with student work. It is an event that brings staff, students, family, and the community together to honor a year's worth of amazing accomplishments.

The admission process is a journey of discovery and invitation. RGNS host "Front Door Fridays" welcoming perspective families to visit, tour the campus, and discuss any questions they have about the school, the experience, and dreams for the future. Students may apply online at www.rabungap.org.




